The AILA CLIL ReN is an international network of colleagues engaged in furthering practice and research in the field of Content and Language Integrated Learning, immersion and other multilingual pedagogies. In 2025-27, our focus is on the practice-research nexus, across educational levels and contexts. What we mean by this is that educators and researchers work together and learn from each other, to keep developing the field. So, although we are a research network, we are not only interested in statistics and scientific journals: daily experiences of teachers and teacher educators are at least, if not more, important if we want to keep developing in sustainable and relevant ways.

With this in mind, our activities over the 2025-27 ReN period will involve the following:



- A **newsletter** for ReN members, published 3 times per year, containing updates from research and practice

## The first event of CLIL ReN (2025-2027)



At the 2025 World CLIL Conference, jointly organised by Maynooth University Department of Education, Post-Primary Languages Ireland and Queen's University Belfast, the new CLIL ReN organised its first event. Echoing their focus on CLIL practice-research nexus, the three convenors organised a 50-minute workshop cum round-table discussion aiming to create connections between researchers and practitioners across educational levels and contexts. During the workshop, the convenors first introduced the focus and ultimate goals of the renewed CLIL ReN. They then shared some examples of how teacher and researcher collaboration has worked in practice, inviting the participants to share their own collaborative experience and discuss benefits and challenges of such collaboration. In particular, they prepared a framework outlining a continuum of possible roles of researchers and teachers during collaboration (e.g., respondent/participant, validator/translator, co-creator/co-inquirer), and invited the participants to share their experience, existing projects or expectations. The workshop was well attended, with researchers, teacher educators and teachers actively contributing and exchanging their ideas. The convenors aim to carry the resulting ideas forward into the CLIL ReN's activities up to 2027, and hopefully beyond.
